**PURPOSE:**

To ensure that any waste that may have long term impact on the Commission and its facilities, are subject to environmental, engineering and regulatory due diligence before they are accepted.

**POLICY:**

1. Acceptance of Liquid Sump Waste is subject to Federal and Provincial Statutes and Regulations, and any Mackenzie Regional Waste Management Commission Policies and applicable Municipal Bylaws.
2. Disposal of Liquid Sump Waste will be charged according to the prevailing fee schedule.
3. The total cost of cleaning up contaminated Liquid Sump Waste will be charged back to the hauler. Contaminates are classified as anything other than non-contaminated soil or water.

**RESPONSIBILITIES:**

1. The waste generator is required to do initial testing to prove that the waste generated is acceptable for disposal at the Mackenzie Regional Landfill. Additional testing is not required unless the nature of the sump waste or operations change, or if a load is suspected of being unacceptable. Amended December 5, 2006
2. The hauler must complete a waste manifest form for each load hauled from each location. Amended December 5, 2006
3. The waste hauler must also fill out part of the manifest to inform the scale operator of the material they wish to dispose of, where the material came from and if there are any contaminants.
4. The waste hauler will be required to dispose the material in the designated disposal area.
5. The landfill operator will inspect the load for contaminants and has the authority to do a grab sample at any time.
6. The Board shall be responsible for the review and update of this Policy. Amended December 5, 2006
